## Latitude 33 awarded 5 new projects

San Diego-based Latitude 33 Planning and Engineering has been awarded five new projects since the beginning of the year, the company announced.

The new contracts following three years of steady growth, with a 50 percent increase in revenue and adding 20 staff members, according to a news release.

Latitude 33 was chosen to provide civil engineering design, consultation and support services as-needed to the city of Encinitas. The firm has worked on several projects in Encinitas for multiple clients, including San Diego Unified School District and Scripps Encinitas.

In partnership with Katz Architects, Latitude 33 was awarded the city of Imperial Beach Senior Center project, which is the company's second civic building in Imperial Beach.

The firm previously identified a sewer capacity problem for UC San Diego and the city of San Diego. The company was awarded a project to improve the UC San Diego sewer system along Gilman Drive, according to the release.

Latitude 33 will partner with Hensel Phelps and Mithun Architects on the Nuevo West Graduate Student Housing project, namely the second phase of the East Campus student and faculty housing project.

In Pacific Highlands Ranch, the firm will work with Hanna Gabriel Wells Architects on a library project.

"In recent years, Latitude 33 has expanded its market sector diversification with more project awards in civic buildings, public works, healthcare, education and military sectors," Latitude 33 principal Matt Semic said in a statement. "We are excited to bring our expertise to a growing roster of clients and projects in the San Diego region."
