

UNDER CONSTRUCTION



BUILDING MORE THAN 3,100 HOMES THROUGHOUT SAN DIEGO COUNTY

San Diego County needs more homes. For those of us in the development industry, the term "housing shortage" has become a regular part of our vernacular. It seems San Diego is perpetually playing catch-up when it comes to building housing.

To help address the housing shortfall, Mayor Gloria introduced his Homes For All of Us package last July, aimed at producing more homes at all income levels. Homes For All of Us includes numerous strategies to expedite the development of all types of housing throughout San Diego. He explains, "A roof over your head at a price you can afford is the goal of this housing package... We need to build a lot more homes that are affordable at varying income levels. This series of initiatives will help do that." The first part of the Homes For All of Us initiative was signed by Mayor Gloria on March 14, 2022. A second phase will be presented to City Council later this year.

Endeavoring to be part of the solution, Latitude 33 currently has 3,107 homes under construction throughout San Diego County. Latitude 33's projects include both for-sale and for-rent homes, single family and multi-family, market-rate and affordable. Latitude 33 has homes under construction from Chula Vista to Bonsall, and from La Mesa to Valley Center.





Many of the new homes throughout San Diego County are being built in South County. The San Diego Union-Tribune's Phillip Molnar recently reported, "Chula Vista's masterplan community Otay Ranch alone has around 1,165 new apartments under construction. Otay Ranch also has the most for-sale homes of anywhere in the county this year, making it the center of residential development in San Diego County."

As part of the South County housing development boom, Latitude 33 currently has two projects in Chula Vista. Pinnacle at Millenia within the Otay Ranch master plan will offer 132 for-sale townhomes, and Union Apartments on Bonita Glen Drive will offer 170 apartments.

Housing is also being built at a rapid pace in North County. Latitude 33's The Porches at Park Circle will bring 143 of the 632 homes coming to the Park Circle master plan in Valley Center. The highly popular community will become a lively residential hub in the rural area. Latitude 33 also has 165 single family homes in the early stages of construction in Bonsall.

San Diego County has a long way to go before housing supply and demand equalize. However, Latitude 33 aims to answer the call to make homes available to all residents. With projects like Terrazzo Bougainvillea, Merge 56, The Porches at Park Circle, and more, Latitude 33 is proud to join its development partners in doing its part turn the housing shortage into a housing equilibrium.


